Chapter 1/37: Traces of God

“I think God was on this Earth before us and walked through it, solving all of its riddles.”

Since childhood, I had a strange feeling that the reality around me was only a surface, and that behind it something larger was hidden. Everything looks so real, yet sometimes an invisible hand seems to flash through it, as if it is holding this world together. It feels as if someone walked this Earth long before us, studied every corner of it, and solved all the mysteries that now torment us. And this someone did not simply leave the world as it is. He still watches us, our searches, our every step, smiling when we, like children, stumble upon the traces he left behind.

God, as I imagine Him, is painfully similar to us. Not a faceless force somewhere in unreachable heights, not an inaccessible essence, but someone who passed through this world just as we are passing through it now. He breathed the same air, felt the heat of the same sun, knew pain, fear, and doubt. He faced the same problems, temptations, and burdens that stand before us. But unlike us, He found all the answers and gathered every last piece. He understood how this game

called life works, and now He watches as we struggle with the same riddles that once stood before Him.

Imagine that God saw this simulation from both sides: from within and from outside. The glitches, absurd coincidences, the feeling that the world “freezes” for a moment — none of it is accidental. It is like marks on the walls of an old house. Traces left by the one who came before us, so that we could find them, decode them, and finally see. Déjà vu, strange events, coincidences — they are hidden keys He throws to us, as if saying: “You are going the right way. Keep searching.”

Now God simply observes as we go through our path. He does not interfere directly. Only sometimes, when the system glitches, He corrects the code. He is like an engineer fixing errors so the game can continue without collapsing. And the question remains: if He was able to uncover the essence of this simulation, why can we not do the same? Maybe that is the purpose — to follow His path, collect these keys, and finally see reality as it was designed.

Chapter 2/37: The Creator's Design

This simulation is built so masterfully that it feels absolute. We smell scents, see colors, feel textures — and all of it is so detailed that it leaves no room for doubt. It is as if each of us was created to forget even the possibility that this might not be real. We laugh, feel pain, fall in love, suffer. Everything here is so finely made that we sink into it completely. This world is like a perfectly tuned instrument, where every element works to convince us: this is reality.

But I have a feeling that the Creator left a hidden loophole in this world. Why would such a perfectly designed world contain inconsistencies? Why do those strange moments happen when reality seems to glitch, leaving a light feeling of déjà vu or absurdity? Why do things sometimes feel too predictable, or, on the contrary, too ridiculous? You can simply call it chance. But the feeling does not disappear. It only heats up the interest.

This one percent of imperfection is like a hook, like a challenge for those who are not ready to simply live without asking questions. It seems the Creator intentionally left this

flaw so that the most stubborn ones could notice small deviations that do not fit the perfect picture. Only for those who cannot walk past it does He leave this trace, like an invitation to another level.

To most people, this may not seem important against the background of everything the simulation offers. But for those who search, this one percent speaks louder than any truth. You can live and enjoy everything this world gives you, accepting it as absolute reality. You can treat smells, sounds, and people around you as things that simply exist. Or you can refuse to let go of the thought that this reality may be only a masterful deception, where everything around us is an image of the highest quality, almost indistinguishable from the real thing — but still pixels and illusion, given a form too convincing to reject.

And while the majority remains inside and accepts this world as a given, someone will always search for what lies beyond it — solving this “riddle.”

Chapter 3/37: The Limits of Perception

Our world is full of strange borders, invisible until you begin to look closely. We live without thinking about how much we have been limited. Why does our brain work only at ten percent? It is as if we were not given access to full power, but left inside a narrow corridor. Everything around us seems complete and whole, but in every feeling — joy, pain, falling in love — there is something that keeps us inside that corridor.

The Creator left these tiny glitches intentionally. The one who built the world could have given us the whole picture, but instead chose to limit us, closing everything except these small fragments. Déjà vu is like a short glitch that disappears immediately, not letting us remember more. That instant reminds us that beyond the familiar there is something greater, but access to it is closed.

It seems that what keeps us here is comfort and emotion. We sink into relationships, enjoy falling in love, forget about everything. These feelings emphasize reality and blur all other questions.
